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Scaling Integrated Care in Europe – What does it take?

Tool support for assessing the maturity of a health system

“Experience shows that tools such as the maturity model are best supported by computer-based tools. This tool will We present the initial version of such a tool for the B3 Maturity Model. We consider, the process the tool is intended to support, the role of evidence in the process, and support for negotiation. We also consider the development process for the tool, and prospective issues such as the extent to which the tool can span linguistic boundaries and how future versions of the tool will support twinning and coaching activity.”
